Firstly—Thank you to all the parents and children who attended the Meeanee Sevens Sports Day on Thursday last week. All of the children seemed to have a fantastic time and represented themselves and Patoka School in a positive manner. Congratulations.

Future of Events and Sports Days.

The attendance at the Meeanee Sevens was disappointing - 21 students (28% of the school) were absent. A number of different reasons were received by the school—examples; didn't know the event was on, children didn't want to go, couldn't transport, hadn't had time to arrange transport, no reason given.

We do understand that the event clashed with the show.

We also understand that everyone is busy and taking time off work to attend events is difficult especially during this busy time of the year.

History

The reasons that we request parents to transport or make transport arrangements are:

- For some events if we all had to meet at school first we would be late and therefore not able to take part.
- 2. Buses cost between \$600 to \$900 per event (around \$10 per child)
- Quite often people use the time after the event to complete other town business and therefore don't want to transport other children.
- 4. In the past the majority of parents have wanted to support their children's sporting endeavours and have been able to attend.

One of our School Strategic Directions is Sport. This includes:

- Provide opportunities for students to engage / take part in a range of sporting activities.
- Promote and encourage involvement in sporting opportunities.

As a staff we have strived to provide opportunities both in and out of the school to achieve this strategic direction and consider the sport days an important element.

Moving Forward.

We have been invited to attend two more sporting events this term.

- 1. Athletics with St Matthews at Hastings Boys.— Friday 16th November.
- 2. Top Team at Pakowhai School.—first week in December.

What does the parent community want us to do to ensure that all students are able to attend school events and sporting fixtures for the remainder of 2012? (to be revisited in 2013).

We have come up with a number of possible solutions:

- Patoka School doesn't attended the sporting events.
- A teacher remains at school and the children who cannot arrange transport attend school as normal (school buses will run).
- We all use buses and the cost is passed on to the parents (approximately \$10 a trip).
- We call for offers of transport from parents and the school organises the car groups, transport routes, etc. (a dollar value will be charged for each trip to be given as a donation to the parents who provide transport)

Please note: option 3 and 4 will only work if we can arrange with the organising schools a slightly later starting time.


